Pastor's Page



LifePoint International Ministries will start to worship here Sunday, October 15 at 11:30 a.m. They are very excited about being able to worship in our large, beautiful sanctuary! When they were here seven years ago, they only worshiped in fellowship hall. So, this is a big deal for them. As part of this special day for us and them, we are going to put out some special snacks during our fellowship time and share them with LifePoint folks. We would like to show their church how welcoming and warm we are at Church on the Hill. I hope you will join in that Sunday by being here and showcasing our COTH kindness! If you have a name tag, please wear it that day especially.

One of the differences between LifePoint and Church on the Hill is our level of worship elements. LifePoint will bring their LED screen, four cameras, sound system, and lighting system. All of these will be available for us to use! The truth is, we could never afford this massive equipment upgrade. We only have a Facebook video post from Marit's or Sarah's cell phone. Now we will have

four video cameras to record and produce our worship service. We have a sound system that many people who listen on Facebook complain about as it does not produce high sound quality. They are not able to hear me, other speakers, and singers. Now, we will be able to use a super high-quality speaker and sound board that Lifepoint will bring with them. Our lighting system consists of lights that leave areas of the chancel, including our Communion table, in the dark. We have multiple burned out lights in hard-to-reach places. LifePoint will place their amazing lighting system in the sanctuary next to ours. Now we be able to use these lights to shine a new and brighter image of our sanctuary and worship to us who are in attendance and those who watch in their homes. Finally, the LED screen will probably take some getting used to. But the screen has the potential to be an amazing tool, especially to draw in and speak to younger generations.

The stained-glass window roots us in our faith by its glorious colors, graceful beauty, and forceful cross. Yet, the swooping roof line and arching ceiling beam communicate that faith is lived beyond the merely traditional. We are called to look forward and upward to where our path extends in front of us. I believe wholeheartedly that something great is to be made from Church on the Hill!

I hope you will join me in the exciting, brand-new times that we have before us at our church. I hope you will keep the faith. I hope you will see the opportunity stretching before us and at our fingertips. I hope you will enlarge your mind and embolden your faith to include something you never saw before. It is true: facing challenges and embracing possibilities will make us a passionate church, rousing us from slumber, and showing us to be much more than we may have believed we were.

With God, all things are possible—that is the essence of faith, and a life lived fully in God's will and Christ's grace, the Spirit working through it. hope you believe that for Church on the Hill all things are possible.

October Teachings

October 1 Mark 9:33-41

Whose Side Are You On?

The point of World Communion Sunday is to express the underlying unity of Christians throughout the world. And yet, it is more than that. Today is about more than Christians saying that even though in many ways we are different, we are still united in Christ. Because if that is all this day is, then the greater truth undercuts this first truth. The greater truth of World Communion Sunday must be found in giving witness to the underlying unity of all of humanity.

October 8 Mark 12:38-44

(Don't) Give Until It Hurts

Today's reading is a bit more complicated than most people might think and different from the way it has been bent by most scholars, preachers, churches, and Christians. The traditional interpretation of this remark renders the widow a hero, someone worth emulating, a selfless giver who gives until it hurts, and so on. However, this was not what Jesus was getting at in this passage. Jesus was protesting this.

October 15 Matthew 9:35-38

Have Have a Spleen!

Our English word compassion in the Greek New Testament is the word *splanchnizomai*. It's the root for our word spleen. It's your guts, intestines, the pit of your stomach. Jesus felt for these people in the pit of his stomach. Now that's compassion. So, instead of saying, "Have a heart! We could say, "Have a spleen!"

October 22 2 Corinthians 3:12-18

Feel the Love

It's important we choose which emotions we're going to follow. So often what arises first in us may not be best. It's easier to get angry, to find fault, to tell others so and so is wrong and means to hurt others. But to do this is to take a chance on not just being wrong but on taking the wrong path. As Proverbs 28:14 says, "A tenderhearted person lives a blessed life; a hardhearted person lives a hard life."

October 29 Deuteronomy 26:1-5

You Can Do This

Taking a trip is a great thing, but wandering through life isn't. It's easy to drift through a day or a month. A year can go by and you think what just happened. We get distracted so easily. We shouldn't wander in our lives but should set down some serious roots in a purpose that God can bless and we can build our lives around. Scripture says, "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."

Team Updates

News from the Vision Ministry by Sarah Hugus, Acting Church Moderator

Stewardship Drive - Very soon we will launch the giving season to fund our ministries going into 2024. This year's theme is "Because of You, Our Church Changes Lives." We think about the eight recovery meetings that COTH hosts every week in our roomy Fellowship Hall. More would like to come here if there were times available. Keeping our sanctuary in good shape is welcoming to new people and all who worship here and can serve as a beautiful background for couples wanting a church wedding. We charge fees for weddings, which are used to help maintain our facilities. Welcoming 2 other worship groups or churches regularly and a weekday licensed preschool into our space is a good use of resources rather than have our building sit empty. Our unusual and attractive architecture attracts attention in our neighborhood, with never ending costs to keep it up. We dream of being able to build up funds for deferred maintenance. Let's all begin thinking about how important our financial contributions are in being able to provide ministries to others. With increased funding we can create additional ways of Being Church in our community and to help around the world.

LifePoint International Ministries - We expect LifePoint to begin using our building on Sundays very soon - perhaps on Oct. 15. Their congregants will arrive at 11:00 a.m. to prepare for their large worship service at 11:30. They will also have children's worship in the Fellowship Hall before the youth and teens go to their Sunday School classes in the Upper Room and three large classrooms downstairs. They have changed their service time so that we can keep our 10 a.m. service. You will see some changes - we think improvements - in the look of the chancel area and we are invited to make use of their technology during worship. We look forward to getting to know them as we cross paths and to make them feel at home in our beautiful space. Their church is undergoing radical remodeling to better fit their needs. This may be a temporary arrangement or it may continue for years while they are under construction. In future months, LifePoint may request wider access to all of our church spaces throughout the week days and evenings. All COTH members and friends are encouraged to extend a generous welcome to these new friends in our midst. The fees from LifePoint will certainly be put to good use.

Vision Meeting updates - This leadership group has been adjusting the ways we work together to do what is best for our church. In recent months, we have adopted standards of good meeting conduct and covenants recommended by the UCC for how to engage in peaceful and productive discussions.

Suggestions about transparency have been implemented and now digital audio recordings of all meetings are created and kept. They can be referenced for writing minutes, and other purposes.

In August, we voted to suspend the COTH by-laws and allow new at-large members to be approved to serve on the Vision Ministry. By doing this, individuals are not required to take on the leadership of a team AND report for monthly COTH business meetings. In September, we welcomed new At-Large VM members Brandon Triche and David Krombholz and thank them for their talents and time.

Currently Sarah Hugus is Acting Moderator, we have no Vice Moderator, Thomas Brown is Church Clerk, and we jointly consult on Finances. Many thanks to Bob Murphy who leads Deacons, Jerry Clinton who leads Publicity, and Jeannie Clinton who leads Member Care for the time they devote to following through on their team's goals. VM meetings are open to all; with only Vision Ministry members being able to vote on motions. Oct. 2, at 5 p.m., is the next meeting.

We also needed to dip into savings within our investments for about \$3000 in operating expenses. One big ticket item was refurbishing all the vinyl floors in the lower level and painting all 14 doors (x 2 sides), trim, and baseboards. This was in preparation for the pre-school's return in late August, with increased fees for their spaces. We took the lowest of 3 bids and felt the crew did a wonderful job - completing their work in only 2 days. We are very grateful for the connection we had for this work to be done on time and with high quality. Come downstairs and take a look some Sunday!

Giving statements were mailed in September to all 120 family units who identify their COTH contributions. Following that mailing, several givers came through with pledges for which we are always grateful.

Thoughts From My Heart and Mind

I led worship on September 24th and introduced the spiritual discipline of lectio Divina. Here is a summary of the study technique for anyone who would like to consider including it in their private devotional practice.

Lectio Divina is an ancient method of praying the scriptures. It is not a traditional Bible devotional practice which usually includes study and analysis of scripture. It is more of a form of prayer in which a passage is read and understood as God's voice speaking to one's heart and mind through that passage. The passage is read as the living Word of God. One engages in this practice to seek for a deeper personal meaning and the potential for transformation in one's life.

The same short scripture passage is read several times - usually three. Each time the reader should pause and consider what has been read with a moment of silence.

Reading 1: The first reading is to acquaint yourself with the text and to listen with the ears of your heart for God's voice speaking to you in that scripture. Find a word or phrase that speaks most strongly to you. Sit in silence and reflect.

Reading 2: The passage is read a second time with the purpose of hearing and seeing Christ in the text. Ponder the word or words that touched your heart and ask where the word or phrase touches your life that day. Then, sit in silence and reflect on that meaning in a silent prayer.

Reading 3: The final reading is for the purpose of experiencing Christ calling you forth into being. Ask yourself what Christ in the text is calling you to do or to become today or this week. After the final silence you may journal about this experience.

This study time concludes with a short time spent in silent prayer or meditation. Focus on the ways that you know you will fulfill the call you found in the passage. Ask God for help with the ways in which it will be a challenge for you.
