Pastor's Page



A little knowledge goes a long way sometimes...

"Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing their central role in U.S. history. Also known as African American History Month, the event grew out of "Negro History Week," the brainchild of noted historian <u>Carter G. Woodson</u> and other prominent African Americans. Since 1976, every U.S. president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. Other countries around the world, including Canada and the United Kingdom, also devote a month to celebrating Black history.

The story of Black History Month begins in 1915, half a century after the <u>Thirteenth Amendment</u> abolished <u>slavery</u> in the United States. That September, the Harvard-trained historian Carter G. Woodson and the prominent minister Jesse E. Moorland founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH), an organization dedicated to researching and promoting achievements by Black Americans and other peoples of African descent.

Known today as the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH), the group sponsored a national Negro History week in 1926, choosing the second week of February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and <u>Frederick Douglass</u>. The event inspired schools and communities nationwide to organize local celebrations, establish history clubs and host performances and lectures.

In the decades that followed, mayors of cities across the country began issuing yearly proclamations recognizing "Negro History Week." By the late 1960s, thanks in part to the civil rights movement and a growing awareness of Black identity, "Negro History Week" had evolved into Black History Month on many college campuses.

President Gerald Ford officially recognized Black History Month in 1976, calling upon the public to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of Black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history." Today, Black History Month is a time to honor the contributions and legacy of African Americans across U.S. history and society—from activists and civil rights pioneers such as Harriet Tubman, Sojourner Truth, Marcus Garvey, Martin Luther King Jr., Malcolm X and Rosa Parks to leaders in industry, politics, science, culture and more." Great Americans come in all the colors of humanity, religions/no religion, gender/ gender identity, age, original national background, sexual orientation, political leanings. We recognize African Americans because of the tragedy of their original story in being brought to America and the enormity of their contributions once having achieved the right to live their potential.

February 4 Psalm 46:1-7	God's Got Ya So many people check out when tough times come. They go on automatic pilot. They get scared. They don't know where to turn. Perhaps we get overwhelmed. February 18 Ephesians 3:18-19	Beginner's Love Paul prays that we may "know" the love of Christ "which passes knowledge." How can you know something which cannot be known? But, of course, there's no contradiction here. Though the love of Christ is itself beyond all computa- tion, and can never be truly measured, nonetheless it is our business to learn as much as we can about it, and to receive as much of it as we can possibly contain. We're not finished products. Our love can grow.	
February 25 Matthew 5:21-26	Time's Up Mathematics teaches us that "the shortest distance between two points is a straight line." The shortest distance between two people is a straight line. A straight line like: "I was wrong," or "I haven't been honest with you" or "Your actions hurt me," or "I love you too much to allow our relationship to crumble." And that's what Jacob did. He ran a straight line to Esau when he saw him and hugged him. "Then," the Bible says, "They wept." Reconciliation requires vulnerability.

Please nominate yourself or another!


